All horses in the Championship are required to do the “**jog**” for soundness prior to competing. At the BC Summer Games in Kelowna this year a clinic was held for the riders and coaches on how to do this important requirement correctly. As the Summer Games riders progress on to a Young Riders level (in all disciplines) this skill which they learned will help them immensely.

### BC 150 Ride

The Backcountry Horsemen of B.C. Aldergrove and Yarrow chapters rode nine days and 180 kilometres (20 to 30 km/day) starting from the Fort Langley National Historic Site, where Sir James Douglas pronounced B.C. a Crown Colony on Nov. 18, 1858.

The long ride took place July 18 to 26, with the horsemen and horsewomen starting at Fort Langley and ending in Manning Park where the well-traveled group will celebrate B.C.'s 150th birthday at a celebration at Jacobson Lake.

The ride will pass through some of the old Gold Rush trails and track some of the hard terrain the Wild West is famous for.

“The Backcountry Horsemen will actually be following the old brigade trail the Hudson’s Bay Company men traveled in the 1850s.

Road riding was accompanied by a support truck and horse trailer to warn drivers about the group passing through.
