Restrictions	<p><i>Horse Council BC Club Members are equestrian groups defined as non-profit organizations operating on a local or regional basis or to promote a similar interest or breed. Clubs are not eligible for a seat on Horse Council BC's Board of Directors.</i></p> <p><i>Club membership is a privilege not a right and organizations or groups not meeting the criteria may not be given membership. All clubs applying for membership will be required to submit a copy of their current society filing along with their Society number. Clubs who currently hold membership or have within the past three years will be grandfathered for as long as they maintain HCBC membership.</i></p> <p><i>Benefits of a club membership are: Collect HCBC membership applications and fees at your event; Apply for Zone, Core and other HCBC funding; Participate in the Group Commercial Insurance Program through Capri Insurance; Advertise club activities such as fundraisers, educational events, clinics and Sanctioned Competitions on the HCBC website; Apply to receive HCBC Promo Packs; List your organization in the HCBC Industry Guide; Promote your club and events on the HCBC Online Forums.</i></p> <p><i>Continued membership and access to grants and program funding is dependent on activity reports. Each Club will be required to report the following on a yearly basis: Number of members (male, female, junior and senior); Number and brief description of club activities; Number of participants at each activity. Club report form is available online or with club renewal.</i></p> <p><i>Clubs are encouraged to use HCBC programs including BC Heritage and General Performance rules and competition permitting.</i></p>

Zones

ZONE 1 – KOOTENAYS

Regional Districts of Central Kootenay, Kootenay Boundary and Electoral Area A of Columbia-Shuswap Regional District, and including major centers: Castlegar, Cranbrook, Creston, Fernie, Golden, Grand Forks, Kimberley, Nelson, Radium, Rossland, and Trail

ZONE 2 – THOMPSON-OKANAGAN

Regional districts of Central Okanagan, Columbia-Shuswap (excluding Electoral Area A), North Okanagan, Okanagan-Similkameen, Thompson-Nicola, and Electoral Areas A and B of the Squamish-Lillooet Regional District, and including major centers: Armstrong, Ashcroft, Enderby, Kamloops, Kelowna, Lillooet, Merritt, Peachland, Penticton, Revelstoke, Salmon Arm, Summerland, Vernon, and Westbank.

ZONE 3 – FRASER VALLEY

Regional Districts of Fraser Valley, Dewdney Alouette, and Fraser-Cheam, and including major centers: Abbotsford, Anmore, Belcarra, Chilliwack, Coquitlam, Hope, Langley, Maple Ridge, Mission, Pitt Meadows, Port Coquitlam, Port Moody, Surrey, and White Rock.

ZONE 4 – FRASER RIVER-DELTA

The city of Burnaby, the District of Delta, the city of New Westminster, and the city of Richmond

ZONE 5 – VANCOUVER-SQUAMISH

The Regional Districts of Squamish-Lillooet (excluding Electoral Areas A and B), Sunshine Coast, Electoral Area A of the Greater Vancouver Regional District, the Village of Lions Bay, the City of North Vancouver, the District of North Vancouver, the City of Vancouver, and the District of West Vancouver.

ZONE 6 – VANCOUVER ISLAND-CENTRAL COAST

The Regional Districts of Alberni-Clayoquot, Capital, Central Coast, Comox-Strathcona, Cowichan Valley, Mount Washington, Nanaimo, and Powell River, and including major centers: Campbell River, Comox, Courtenay, Cumberland, Duncan, Esquimalt, Ladysmith, Nanaimo, North Cowichan, Oak Bay, Ocean Falls, Port Alberni, Port Hardy, Saanich, Sayward, Sidney, and Victoria.

ZONE 7 – NORTH WEST

The Regional Districts of Bulkley-Nechako, Kitimat-Stikine, and Skeena-Queen Charlotte and including major centers: Burns Lake, Fort St. James, Houston, Kitimat, Masset, Port Clements, Prince Rupert, Smithers, Stewart, Terrace, and Vanderhoof.

ZONE 8 – CARIBOO-NORTH EAST

The Regional Districts of Cariboo, Fort Nelson-Liard, Fraser-Fort George, and Peace River, and including major centers: Chetwynd, Dawson Creek, Fort Nelson, Fort St. John, Hudson Hope, Prince George, Quesnel, Tumbler Ridge, and Williams Lake.
